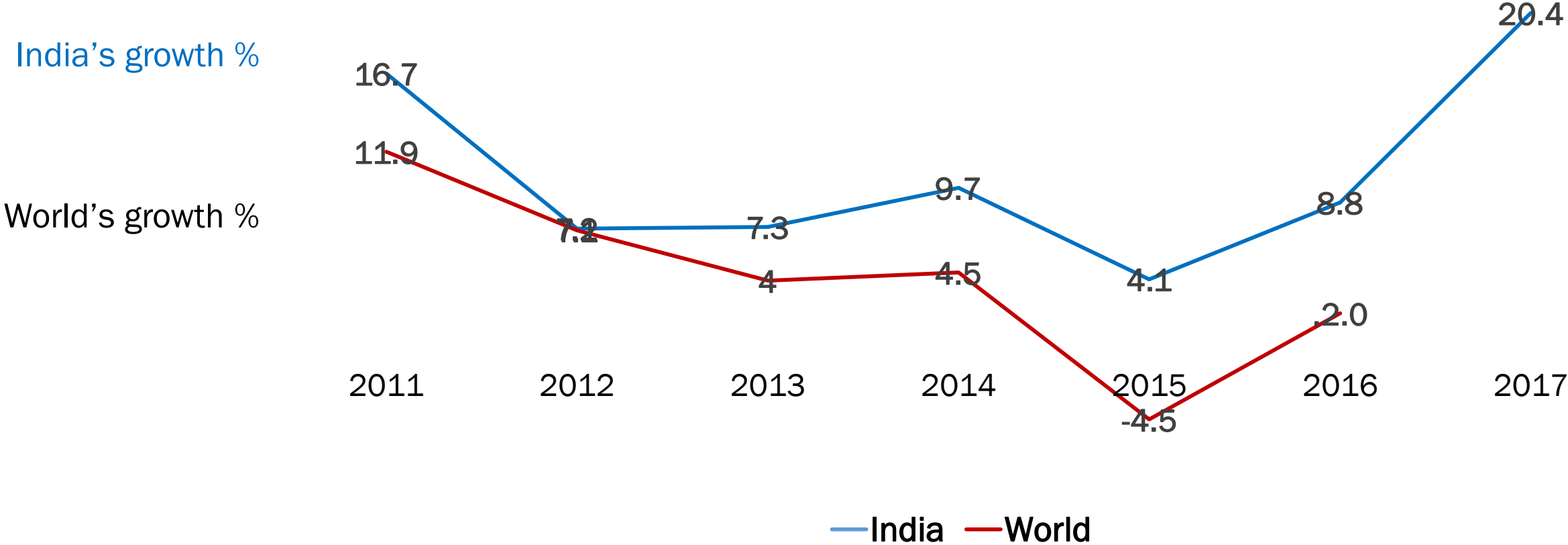

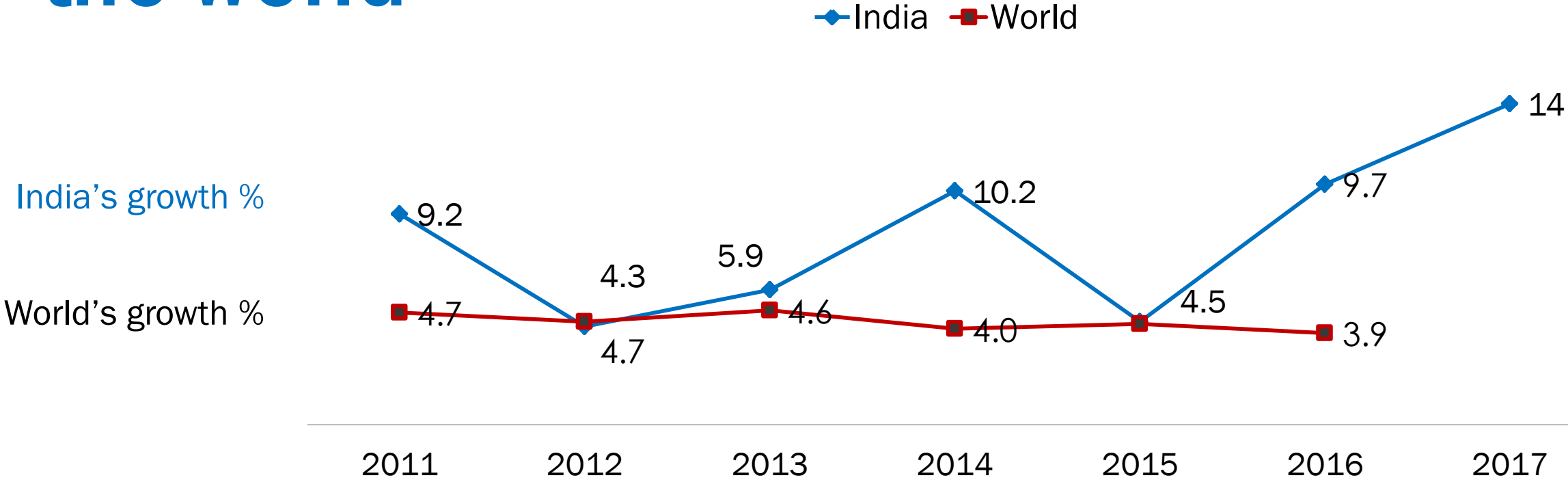

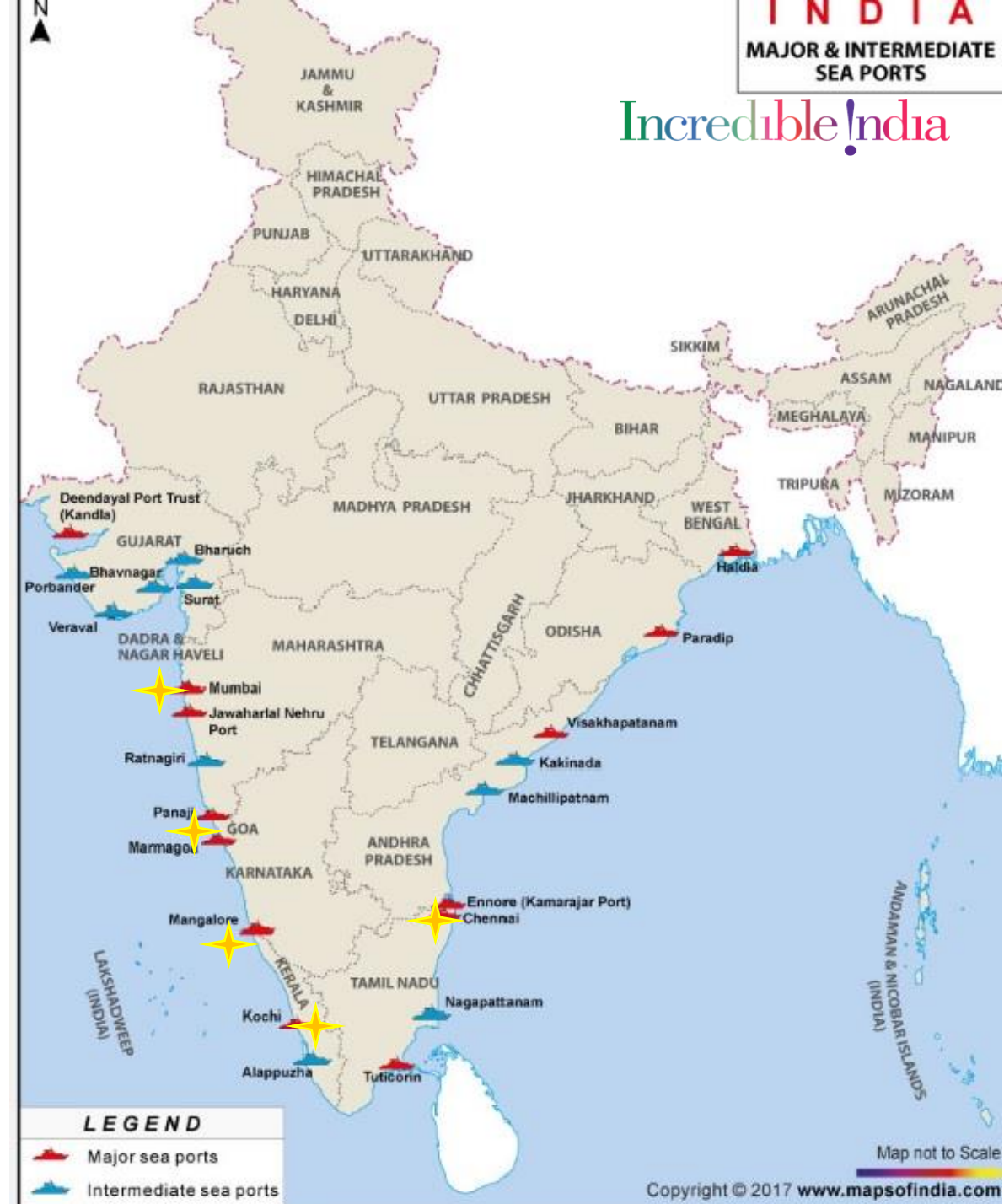

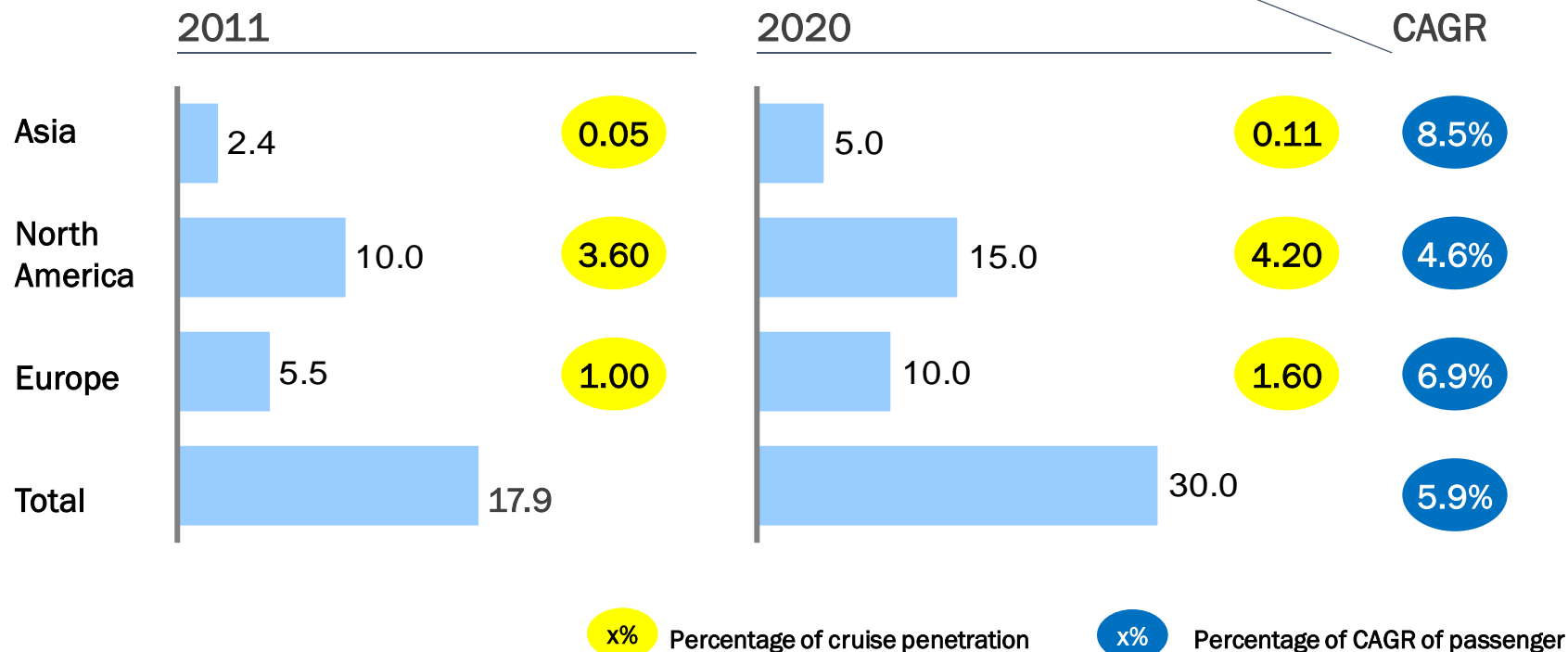

Millions of passengers, Percentage

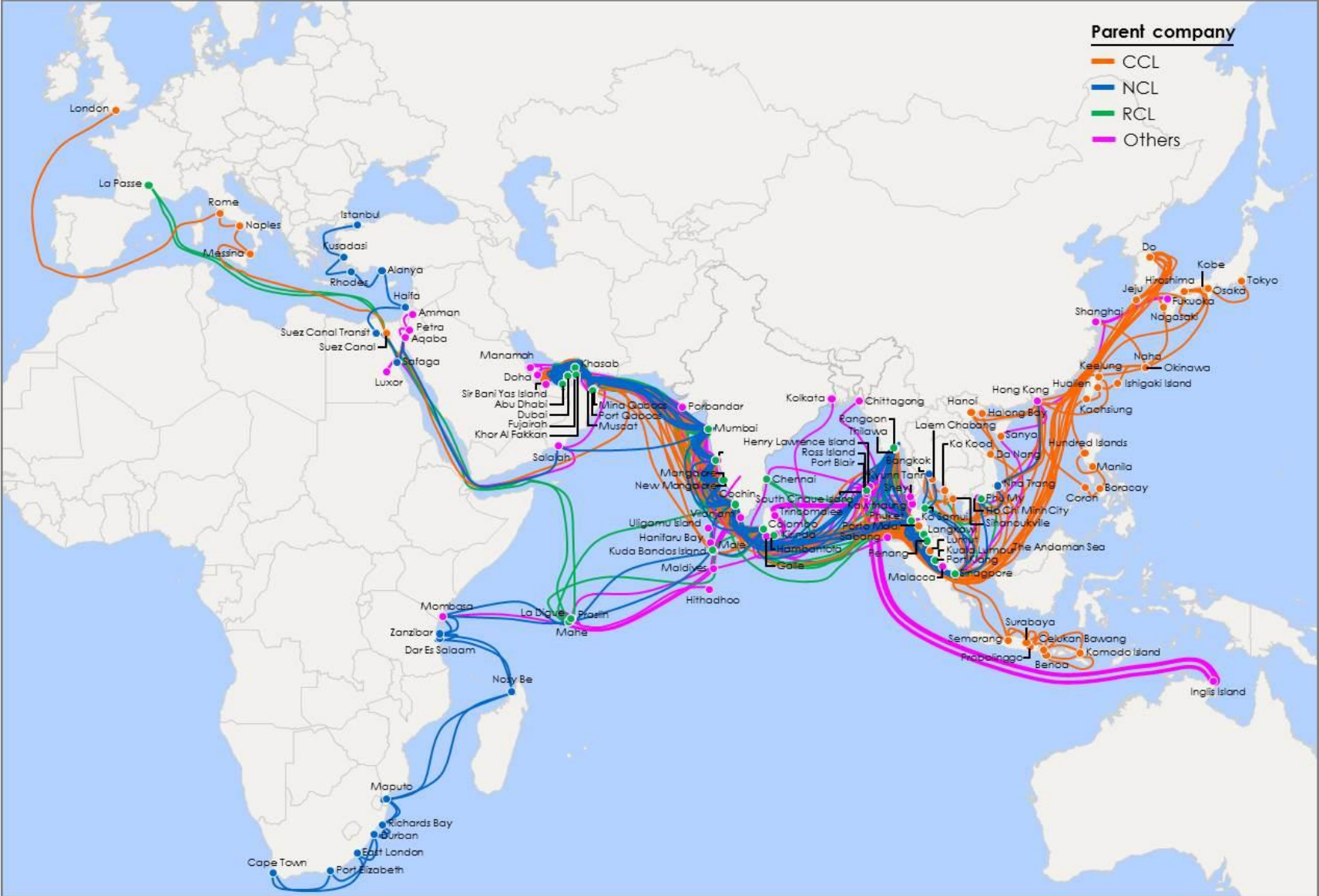


The Asian Cruise market is expected to grow at 8% per annum, and double passenger volume by 2020

- Cruise – Aspirational product. (Independent study by Carnival – 4 million Inbound + Outbound)

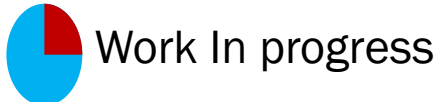
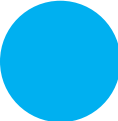

# India- The Fast Emerging Cruise Tourist Destination

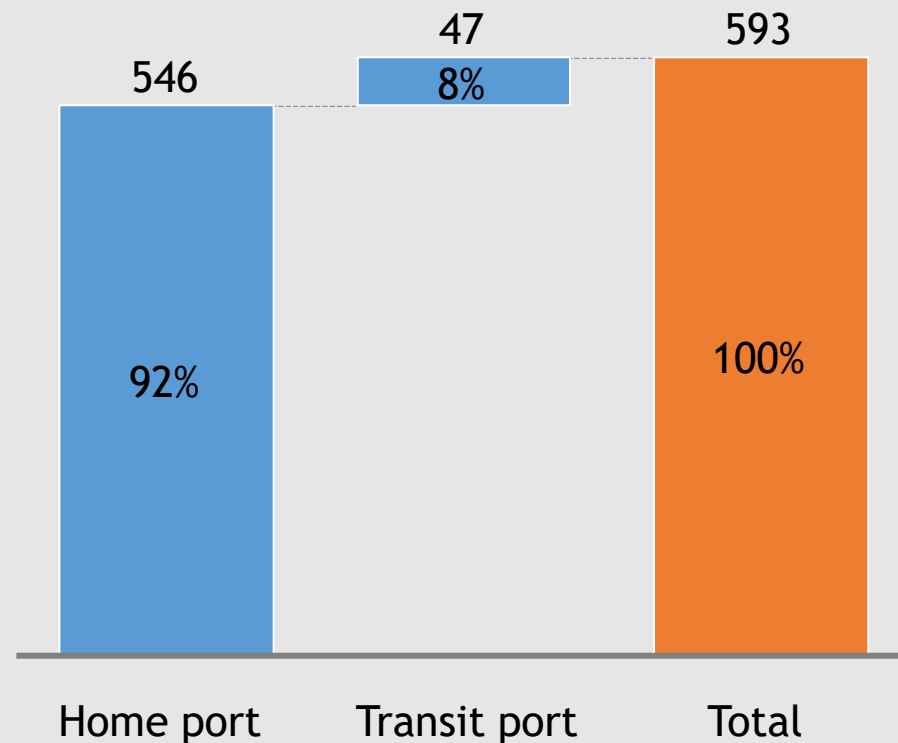

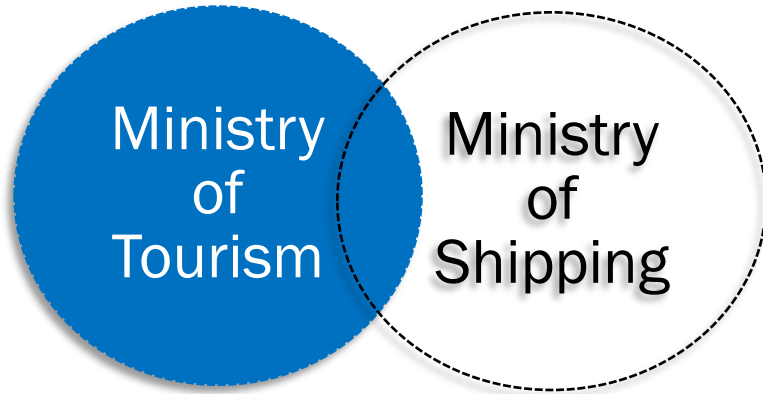
- Highest contribution to economy comes from being a home port location

- Mumbai port is the only home port but has a much lower share of traffic as compared to other ports

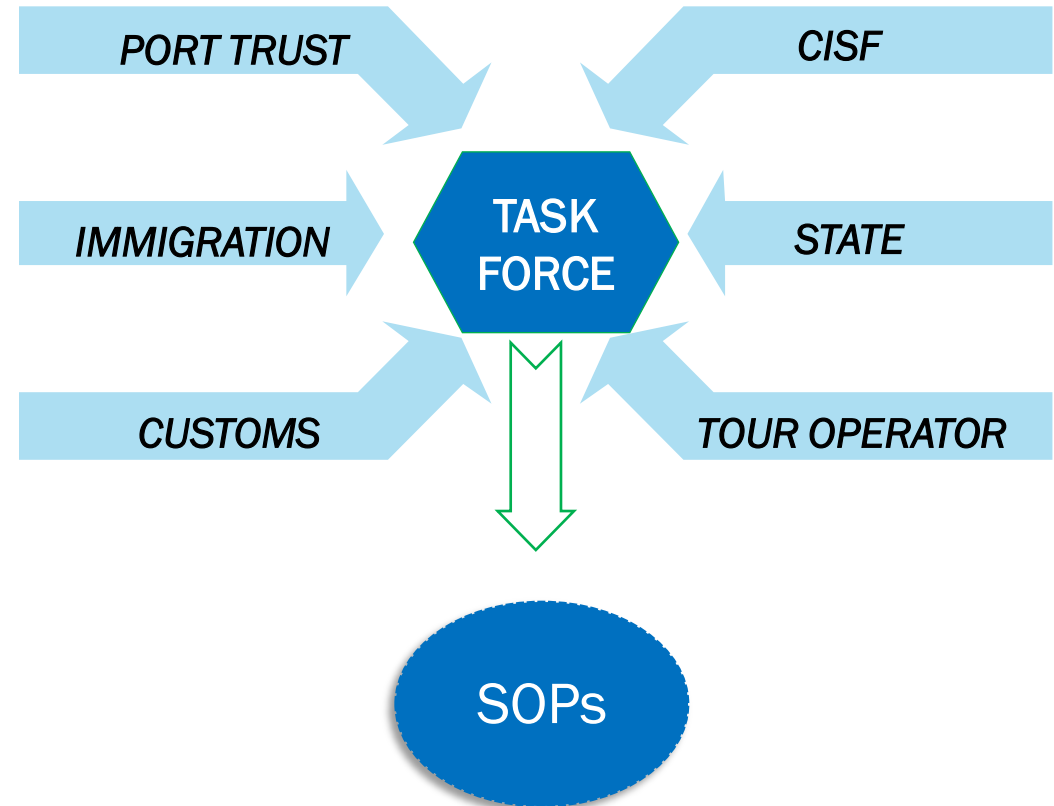

## Key Take Aways

- Cabotage waived, Indians allowed to sail between ports
- Tour operators, coaches, etc. facilitated through Single Long Term Per and Single Point Electronic Clearance
- Creation of entertainment zone i.e. Restaurants, Bars, Shops, etc.
- Pre-paid vehicles with verified/ empaneled drivers
- Facilitate tourists to places of interest with trained guides
- Reception and cultural shows

## Key Take Aways

- **Single point custom clearances for vessel**
  - **Port Health** – Not to board (unless Ship/Crew/Pax from Yellow Fever/notified area)
  - **GST** – Uniform, Single & simplified taxation system introduced
  - **Port & Security**
    - ✓ Electronic access control and RFID on vehicles
    - ✓ Separate cargo and Cruise approaches
    - ✓ Single window system- e permits/ payments

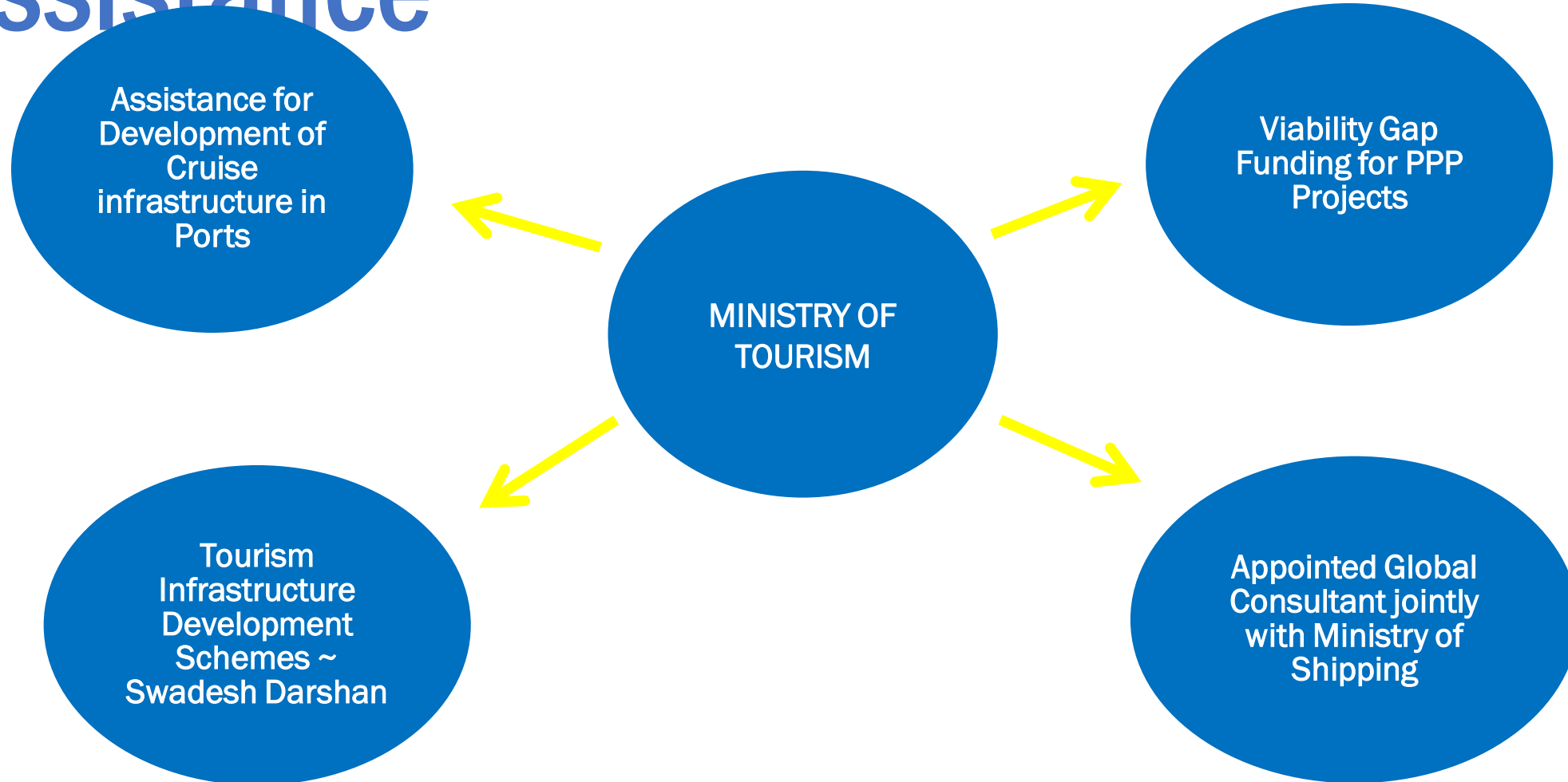

- **Sagarmala Scheme**
  - **Port Modernization & New Port Development:** De-bottlenecking and capacity expansion of existing ports and development of new greenfield ports
  - **Port Connectivity Enhancement:** Enhancing the connectivity of the ports to the hinterland
  - **Port-linked Industrialization:** Developing port-proximate industrial clusters and Coastal Economic Zones
  - **Coastal Community Development:** Promoting sustainable development of coastal communities through skill development & livelihood generation activities, fisheries development, coastal tourism etc.
