## <u>HIGH LEVEL STRATEGIC DIALOGUE ON IORA'S 25 YEARS: REVIEW, REFLECTION, RENEWAL</u> <u>& THE IORA AFRICAN MEMBER STATES AND THE IORA INDO-PACIFIC OUTLOOK</u>

The High-Level Strategic Dialogue on IORA's 25 years: Review, Reflection, Renewal, took place under the theme: IORA Vision 2030 and Beyond, co-hosted by South Africa, Ambassador Anil Sooklal, and the Secretary-General of IORA, Ambassador Salman Al Farisi in Mauritius. The Dialogue was followed by the meeting on "IORA African Member States and the IORA Indo-Pacific Outlook". The aim of the Dialogue was to reflect on the past 25 years of the Association, acknowledge successes, address challenges, and assess implementation of outcomes.

The event was attended by more than 90 senior officials from 20 IORA Member States and 9 Dialogue Partners. Representatives of the Indian Ocean Rim Business Forum (IORBF), the Indian Ocean Rim Academic Group (IORAG), Fisheries Support Unit (FSU) and Regional Centre for Science and Transfer of Technology (RCSTT) also participated in the 2 events.

Participants discussed mutual interests, exchanged insights and identified collaboration opportunities.

The second meeting discussed the perspective of the 10 African Member States of IORA on the implementation of the IORA Indo-Pacific Outlook. The IORA remains steadfast in its commitment to strengthening regional cooperation, sustainable development, and fostering greater engagement among its member states and dialogue partners.

The outcome of the Dialogue is the development of the "IORA Vision" 2030 and Beyond" that is expected to be endorsed at the Council of Ministers (COM) meeting in October 2023 in Sri Lanka.

### WORKSHOP ON NATURE-BASED TOURISM AND LESSONS LEARNED FROM COVID-19 HELD IN MAURITIUS

The Ministry of Tourism in collaboration with the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) hosted a Workshop on Nature-Based Tourism and Lessons Learned from COVID-19 from 03 to 05 May 2023 at Maritim Resort & Spa, Balaclava in Mauritius. The workshop brought together policy-makers and tourism stakeholders from the Indian Ocean Rim and explored different themes such as the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry & understanding how nature-based tourism can be viewed as a solution for recovery building on sustainability and resilience; Tools and Mechanisms for the Sustainable Development of Nature-Based Tourism; Understanding Types of Nature-Based Tourism & Effective Marketing; Visitor Management for Nature-Based Tourism; and Lessons Learned from COVID-19 & Road to Recovery.

The workshop was attended by 14 IORA Member States (Bangladesh, France/Reunion, Iran, Kenya, Madagascar, Malaysia, Maldives, Mauritius, Mozambique, Seychelles, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, UAE) and three Dialogue partners (China, Italy and Türkiye).

H.E. Hon. Othman Masoud Othman, First Vice President of Zanzibar opened the IORA's 9th IORA Indian Ocean Dialogue (IOD), which was was held in Zanzibar, Tanzania, on 22-23 May 2023. The IOD was attended by around 150 participants, including from 14 Member States and 5 Dialogue Partners. The Dialogue saw the participation of government, academics, think-tank, and international organizations from throughout Indian ocean region, who were all gathered on the same platform to explore opportunities for advancing blue growth in the Indian Ocean region.

The 9th IOD adopted the Zanzibar Consensus, which contains a set of policy recommendations to advance blue economy sector in the Indian Ocean region. The document was built from the key takeaways of each session and inputs from the IORA Member States. The Consensus serves as a reference for the Governments and various stakeholders in the Indian Ocean Region to bring Blue Economy to the next level.








### MEETING WITH REPUBLIC OF KOREA, 22 JUNE 2023

More than 80% of the world's global trade is transported through international shipping. As the most affordable and efficient form of transportation for goods, maritime activity continues to be a vital part of the world's trade industry.
